


Barnstable-Yarmouth Metropolitan Area¹

- The white and black shares of enrollment decreased from 1999-2000 to 2010-2011, while Asian, Latino, and mixed all increased.

- Overall enrollment decreased slightly from 25,498 in 1999-2000 to 25,214 in 2010-2011.
- Enrollment in urban schools increased from 3,853 in 1999-2000 to 5,717 in 2010-2011 while enrollment in suburban schools decreased from 19,153 in 1999-2000 to 16,529 in 2010-2011.

¹ This report includes only data from the districts in this metropolitan area that are located in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The 1999 MSA boundaries included Barnstable County.

- White enrollment in both urban and suburban schools decreased.
- Black enrollment in urban schools decreased but increased in suburban schools.
- Asian enrollment, though still a small proportion, increased in both urban and suburban schools.
- Latino enrollment increased in both urban and suburban schools.
